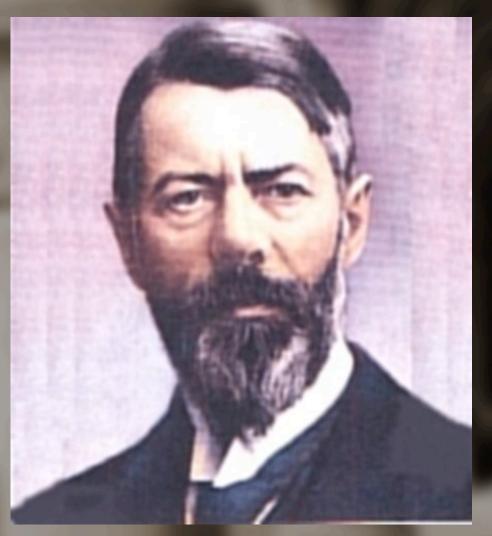

- The Public Domain and Fair Use are Shrinking
  - Gov't Information is Moving to the Private Sector
  - Legislation Secures Owners Rights...Above All

- The Academy Continues to Give Away its Currency to Others' Vaults
  - Scholarly Publishing Far from Reform
- Technologies in Information Dissemination are Increasingly By-Passing Information Sharing
- The Values of Librarianship are Minimized in the Current Market

The Problem: External

- Increasingly Consumer-Oriented Institutions
- Lack of Accepted Benchmarks for the Networked World
- Enticed Academy into Cyberspace (Congratulations)
  - ...Without Us
- Bibliofundamentalism
  - Karen G. Schneider



- Bureaucracy and Reductionism assumes:
  - Static, discoverable environment
  - Unimpeded Flow of Information
- Real Life is Complex!

- Paralysis through Analysis



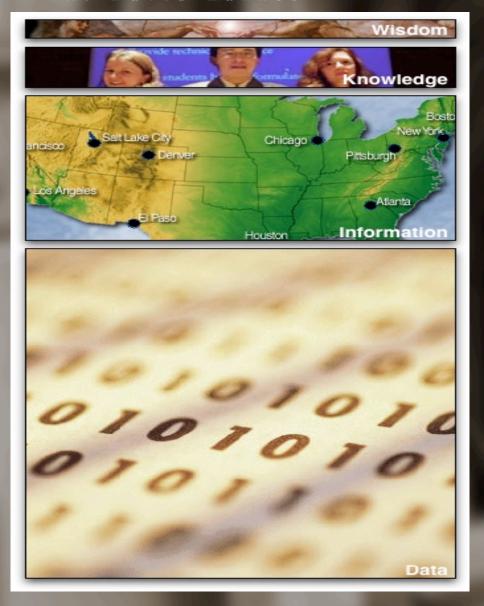
Daedalus' Maze

# Functions of a Knowledge-Driven Library

- Academic Library as the Knowledge Managers of the Academy
  - Faculty are their Own Archivist and Publisher
  - IT is buying Full-Text Databases
  - Distance Education...Academy's New Knowledge Creation

- The Tools of the Knowledge Organizations *ARE* the Tools of the Information Age
- Networks of Connected Applications
  - Computers
  - Smart Phones
  - TV's, Cars, Watches, etc.
- Information Processing Applications
  - Data Creation: "Office for your work life, iLife for everything else." -Steve Jobs
  - Data Manipulation: Databases, Data Mining, Spreadsheets, Stats Packages, etc.
  - All Connected to the Network, On Demand

#### Here's the Catch

- Information (and Knowledge) has Escaped the Confines of Text
  - A Digit is a Digit
    - The transformation of TV (TiVO, TV Stations with a Staff of one)
- The Computer Science Community is Unprepared
  - Digital Preservation, Digital Libraries without Name Authority, the Hidden Web
- We are at the Mercy of the Computer Scientists

# Librarians Step into the Void

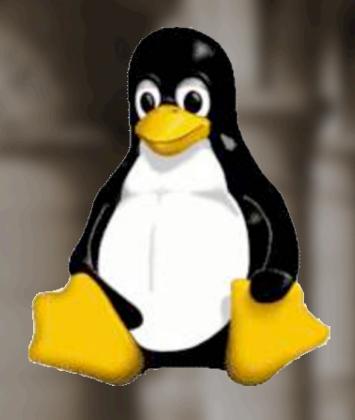
Solution?

Examples

- Community Development Works
  - And Open Source Doesn't Have to be Free
- Innovation Does Not Have a Job Title
- Sweat is as Good as Money
- More Money Doesn't Equal More Performance
- Technology Can Coordinate Massive Efforts
- Preservation of the Commons is NOT a Passive Activity
  - Actively Develops Good Product
  - Actively Benchmarks Itself Against the World
  - Actively Gains Converts and "Expands the Tent"

- Names Don't Matter, People Do!
  - Digital Reference is About Putting People in the Interface...What's on Your Web Site
- Librarians Must Retake the Web!
- Share in Public
  - Successes and Failures
- Organizational Type Doesn't Matter
- Peer to Peer Rules
- There are NO Sacred Cows
- Let the Zealots Lead
