Redefining the Business

- Administrations Often Schizophrenic On Teaching and Research
- Purpose of Library: Accelerating the Scholarly Conversation

Perhaps it is an overstatement to say that academic librarians are drifting in a vast sea of information and technological advances, searching for an appropriate course of action. Nevertheless, we appear to have lost the stabilizing rudder of confidence in who we are and what we are to do.

Over 62% of all departments report that publication has increased in importance in tenure decisions over the last ten years. The percentage of departments ranking scholarship of primary importance (over teaching) has more than doubled since the last comparable survey, conducted by Thomas Wilcox in 1968: from 35.4% to 75.7%

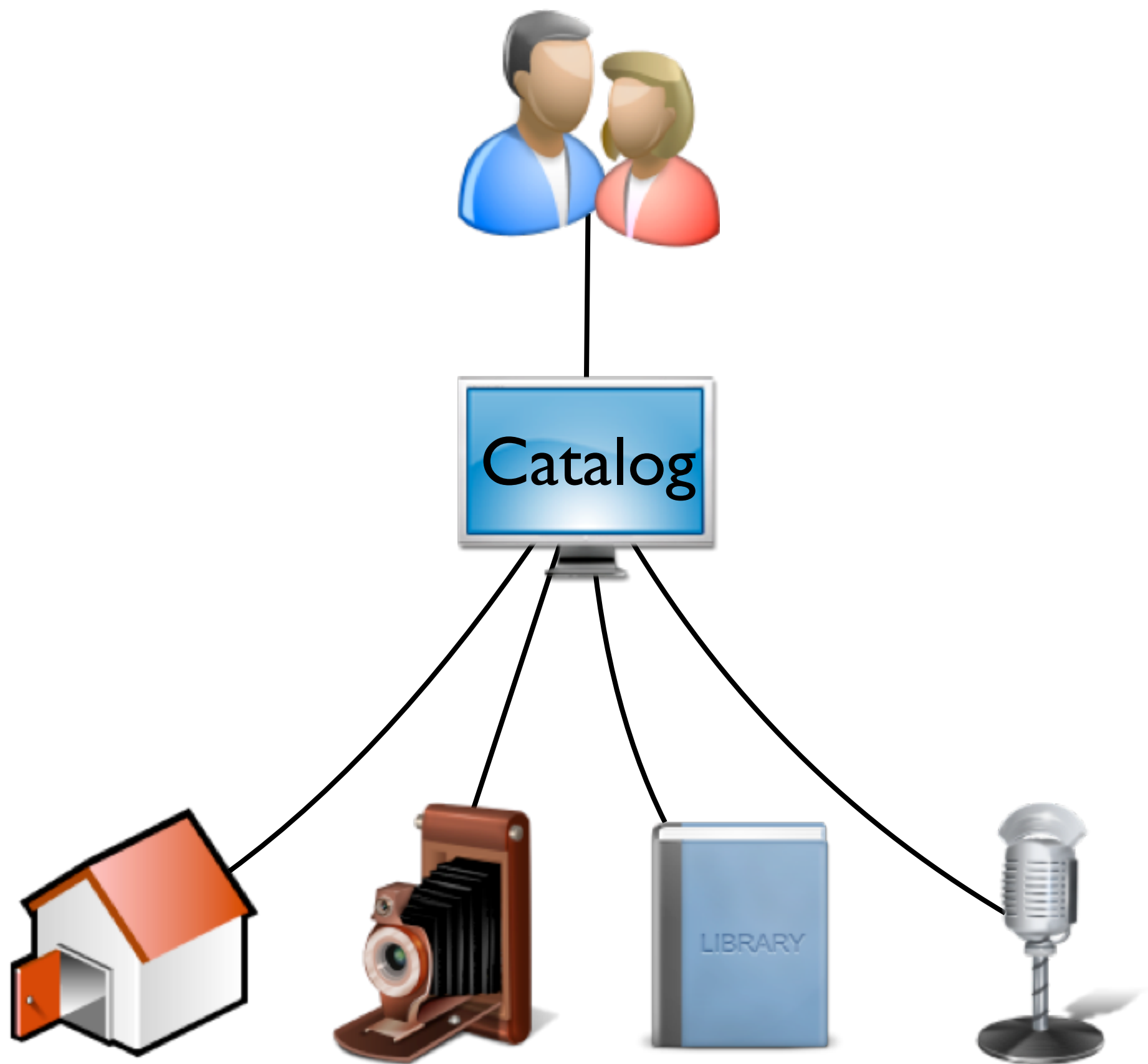
As suggested by the main title of a recently published article, “Publish or Perish” (Bunz, 2005), publication expectations are a significant part of the promotion and tenure process for faculty members. Once the exclusive purview of doctoral granting universities, research expectations, including publishing in academic journals, are now common for a range of other colleges and universities.

Slow Diversification of Mesozoic Tetrapods
